Project Progress: Content, Key Tools, and Upcoming Workshop in Valencia

After the first months of collaborative work, the Green New Home team is pleased to share the latest progress made within Work Packages 3 (WP3) and 4 (WP4), focused respectively on defining key soft skills and developing tailored learning content for migrants interested in sustainable entrepreneurship.

As part of WP3, a common template has been designed and shared with project partners to help structure and define soft skills and related learning outcomes in a consistent and coherent way. This tool aims to ensure alignment across all contributions, allowing each skill to be clearly described, practically framed, and easily transferable. The document was reviewed by all partners, whose comments contributed to its finalization.

In parallel, under WP4 – *Development of the Personalised Strategy Maker mobile app* – the first two pilot content items have been produced, serving as a foundation for the next stages of learning resource development:

- **Strategy Scenario #1:** A story-based example illustrating the journey of a Ukrainian migrant woman starting a green microbusiness in Poland. The scenario highlights real challenges and opportunities of sustainable entrepreneurship from a migrant's perspective.
- **Personalised Strategy Content #1:** A practical guide that translates the scenario into concrete steps and guidance for adult learners wishing to build their own sustainable business.

These content items will be reviewed by the consortium to maximise their impact through partners' feedback.

In addition, we are pleased to announce that the first project workshop will take place in Valencia, Spain, in October 2025. This face-to-face meeting will be an excellent opportunity to reinforce collaboration within the project. A draft agenda, welcome pack, and participant registration form have already been shared with all partners so they can proceed with registering their participants.

The project is moving forward steadily, combining research, practical insights, and digital tools to support migrants and refugees on their journey toward green entrepreneurship.
