Project Updates: New Infographic, SAC Meeting, and Upcoming Transnational Meeting in Palermo

The Green New Home project continues to move forward with new developments in communication, stakeholder engagement, and content creation. This month, the consortium is pleased to share updates related to the Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC), new learning materials, and upcoming project activities.

As part of our ongoing dissemination efforts, a new infographic has been developed and will shortly be available on the Green New Home website, while information inspired by its content has already been shared on our social media channels. This visual resource introduces the role and importance of the Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC), a key component of the project that ensures quality, relevance, and local impact. The SAC brings together a diverse group of external professionals from across partner countries, including representatives from entrepreneurship, education, migration support services, and both public and private sectors. Their role is to provide critical feedback, validate project outputs, and ensure that all tools developed are aligned with real needs in different national contexts. This month's SAC meeting will focus on reviewing current progress and offering strategic guidance for the next phases of the project.

Looking ahead, the consortium will meet in May in Palermo, Italy, for a transnational project meeting. This in-person gathering will include a dedicated working session where partners will discuss upcoming milestones, refine implementation strategies, and coordinate the next steps for project development. The meeting will also serve as an opportunity to strengthen collaboration and align efforts across all participating organizations.

In parallel, significant progress has been made in the development of new learning content, including strategy scenarios integrated into the Personalized Strategy Maker mobile application. These scenarios are designed to simulate real-life situations and support users in building practical skills related to sustainable entrepreneurship. They will play a central role in the app's functionality, helping learners navigate their own entrepreneurial journeys through interactive and tailored guidance.

All these efforts contribute to the broader set of project results, which aim to provide accessible, practical, and impactful tools for migrants and refugees interested in green entrepreneurship.
